Personal Statement

What is it?

It's A One Page Essay Outlining Your Motivating Interests And Strengths As They Relate To Being A Successful Resident in Your Chosen specialty.

IT IS AN OPPORTUNITY TO:



- □ Introduce yourself to the Selection Committee By emphasizing your unique Strengths, Characteristics, enthusiasm, and Personality.
- □ Provide An Overview Of Who You Are And What You Will Bring To The Program/specialty who is the person behind the CV?
- □ PROVIDE INFORMATION ABOUT SOMETHING THAT IS NOT OBVIOUS IN YOUR CV, TRANSCRIPT, OR ERAS APPLICATION. IT IS DISTINCT!
- □ PROVIDE A COMMON TOPIC FOR CONVERSATION DURING INTERVIEWS.

FORMAT / LENGTH

- ☐ START IN MS WORD
- \square SET PAGE MARGINS TO 0.5'' TO 1'' ALL AROUND
- □ SELECT A STANDARD FONT STYLE (ARIEL, TIMES ROMAN, GARAMOND)
- \square USE 10 12 PT. FONT SIZE
- ☐ SINGLE-SPACE
- □ IF WELL WRITTEN, "SHORT & SWEET" HAS MUCH MORE IMPACT THAN "LONG AND WORDY"! KEEP IN MIND HOW MANY STATEMENTS PROGRAMS DIRECTORS READ IN A SHORT TIME FRAME! CUT THE:



- ☐ TYPICALLY, BETWEEN 500 600 (+/-) WORDS* IS AN APPROPRIATE GOAL → (REMEMBER: QUALITY VS QUANTITY!)
- * This is *NOT* a rule or requirement, but an effective length based on my experience.

"DON'Ts"



- 1) <u>DON'T</u> DEFINE THE SPECIALTY (THE PD KNOWS WHAT IT'S ABOUT!):
 - ☐ "EM IS FAST PACED, AND YOU NEVER KNOW WHO'LL WALK THROUGH THE DOORS NEXT!"
 - ☐ "AN ANESTHESIOLOGIST NEEDS TO ESTABLISH QUICK RAPPORT TO CALM ANXIOUS PATIENTS."
- 2) DON'T WRITE MUCH (IF AT ALL) ABOUT HOW YOU "LOVE" OR "ENJOY" ASPECTS OF THE SPECIALTY. THIS IS IMPLIED; PLUS, YOU CAN DO SO ON YOUR INTERVIEWS:
 - "I'VE ALWAYS LOVED CHILDREN; THEREFORE, PEDIATRICS IS THE PERFECT FIT FOR ME."
 - ☐ "I 'M PASSIONATE ABOUT WOMEN'S HEALTH, SO I AM PURSUING OB/GYN."
- 3) LAST, BUT NOT LEAST...DON'T WRITE YOUR STATEMENT LIKE A "CASE REPORT." THIS IS ABOUT YOU, NOT THE PATIENTS YOU HAVE MET.
 - ☐ "Mrs. X. Presented to the family medicine clinic with symptoms of...."
 - □ "NOTICING THAT Mr. Y'S A1C WAS ELEVATED, I DISCUSSED WITH HIM..."
