Internship Certificate Program (ICP)

The ICP is New York Tech's institutional internship program. Our staff works closely with students, faculty and employers to create meaningful experiences for all. Internship employers say that New York Tech interns dive right into work, work well with clients and colleagues, and welcome learning opportunities. Last year, 82% of interns were offered continuing employment.

While students enrolled in internship classes receive ICP support, domestic students can sign up for the ICP and get the same support without registering for an internship course. This is particularly helpful for students whose majors do not require internships, or don't offer internships as elective courses that count toward the degree. This option is not available for F-1 students, as it does not comply with Federal regulations.

Student Employment

We offer employment opportunities on- and off- campus through Federal Work Study (FWS) and Student Aid programs. New York Institute of Technology's programs run from July 1 -June 30.

Federal Work Study Program: Positions are fully funded by the U.S. government and are awarded to eligible students as part of their financial aid package. Funds are earned by working on- or off-campus for an hourly wage. Check myNYIT/Financial Aid Package for your FWS award package. If you do not see an award, but think you may be eligible, please contact the Office of Financial Aid.

Federal Work Study Community Service: Students who have FWS can use these funds to work off-campus at non-profit employers. These positions offer excellent resume-building experiences and opportunities to network. Positions are open to students of all majors. Micro-Internships

Micro-Internships are short-term, paid, professional assignments that are similar to those given to new hires or interns. These projects enable Career Launchers to demonstrate skills, explore career paths, and build their networks as they seek the right full-time role. Unlike traditional internships, Micro-Internships can take place yearround, typically range from 5 to 40 hours of work, and are due between one week and one month after kick-off. Micro-Internships are used by companies ranging from those in the Fortune 100 to emerging start-ups, and go across departments including sales, marketing, technology, HR, and finance.
