

Master of Science in Instructional Technology (M.S.-IT), Educators

The **Master of Science in Instructional Technology (Educators)** program at the New York Institute of Technology - Vancouver (NYIT) develops teachers' knowledge and skills in the use of leading edge media in K-12 classrooms while enhancing inquiry-based teaching and learning. Students apply learning and motivation theory and principles of curriculum design and assessment in order to skillfully integrate technology into subject areas such as language arts, math and science.

Please note that the M.S.-IT program does not qualify students to become K-12 teachers in British Columbia. Those intending to work in the B.C. public school system must apply to both the **Teacher Qualification Service (TQS)** and the **Teacher Regulation Branch (TRB)**. Highlights

- Faculty possess leadership roles in professional associations such as the **British Columbia Teachers' Federation (BCTF)**, the **International Society of Technology in Education (ISTE)**, and the **British Columbia Technology Education Association (BCTEA)**.
- M.S.-IT hosts or sponsors conferences, workshops, and seminars to engage alumni and other stakeholders.
- Students have the opportunity to transfer between New York and Vancouver campuses.
- Financial aid is available to Canadian Citizens and Permanent Residents of Canada.
- Career planning services are available on campus to all students.
- International students are eligible to work off campus (max. 20 hrs/week) during their studies and can qualify for post-graduation work permits (up to three (3) years) after graduation.

The NYIT-Vancouver M.S.-IT Program

M.S.-IT is available for qualified professionals seeking to enhance their expertise in using technology for teaching, learning, training, assessment, curriculum development, collaboration, and problem-solving at all levels. The program meets NYIT's mission of providing a career-oriented professional education with a strong emphasis on original research and access to opportunities for qualified students. Graduates are able to pursue work as teachers in K-12 classrooms (see above), post-secondary institutions, or as technology leaders and trainers, staff developers, or curriculum designers.

Intakes & Duration

There are three (3) terms in every academic year; Fall (15 wks, Sep.-Dec.), Spring (15 wks, Jan.-Apr.), and Summer (8 wks, May-Jul.). M.S.-IT is a two (2) year program.

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Admission Requirements¹

You must possess the following qualifications in order to be **considered** for the M.S.-IT program at NYIT-Vancouver:

A FOUR (4) YEAR BACHELOR'S DEGREE (or equivalent) from an accredited college or university	
A MINIMUM CUMULATIVE GPA OF 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) or equivalent	
DEMONSTRATED PROFICIENCY IN BASIC USES OF CLASSROOM TECHNOLOGY¹	
DEMONSTRATED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY² Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS)	
TOEFL Minimum Score	IELTS (PREFERRED) Minimum Score
INTERNET BASED TEST	OVERALL

How to Apply

All NYIT-Vancouver applications are done online and require a non-refundable \$50 USD application fee. The application process begins here: nyit.edu/admissions/vancouver →

Once you have paid the fee, upload the following documents:

- Four (4) year Bachelor's degree certificate
- Transcripts from **each semester** of your four (4) year Bachelor's degree
- Any transcripts or certificates received beyond your Bachelor's degree program
- Proof of English proficiency (TOEFL or IETLS)²
- Statement of Purpose (*recommended*)
- A copy of your passport
- Two (2) letters of recommendation from professors who are familiar with your undergraduate work (*recommended*)

[1] Minimum requirements. The M.S.-IT program has a limited number of seats and only the best applicants will be admitted to the program. In the event that you do not have the required skills, program faculty will recommend appropriate prerequisite courses to be taken before the beginning of the program.

[2] This is not required if you have completed your Bachelor's degree from an English speaking country such as Canada, the United States, the United Kingdom, Australia, or New Zealand. NYIT-Vancouver reserves the right to test new students for their English proficiency upon arrival on campus.

International students are strongly encouraged to apply at least six (6) months prior to the start of their desired intake term to accommodate the processing of their study permit application with Canadian immigration.

Original documents must be presented to campus officials for verification during new student orientation.

[3] International students must take a minimum of 19.5 credits per year to qualify for Full Time status (7.5 credits in their first term and 6 credits in subsequent terms). If you have earned a bachelor degree from an English speaking country such as Canada or the U.S., you are eligible to apply for a waiver of the Technical Communications course.

[4] For two (2) years. Amount does not include other fees or tuition fees for any prerequisite or bridge courses that may be required. Tuition charges may change during study period without prior notice. See nyit.edu/vancouver/about for updates.

[5] Applications may close earlier than the deadline dates. See nyit.edu/admissions/vancouver for updates.

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Program Overview

The M.S.-IT core curriculum includes 34.5 credits, including nine (9) required courses (27 credits), one (1) elective (3 credits), one (1) supervised project (3 credits), and one (1) Technical Communications course (1.5 credits).

To be **considered**¹ for the program, you must have:

- A four (4) year Bachelor's degree (or equivalent) from an accredited college or university
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) or equivalent
- Demonstrated proficiency in basic uses of classroom technology¹
- Demonstrated English proficiency²

- \$50 USD **non-refundable** application fee
- Bachelor's degree completion certificate
- Semester-by-semester transcripts for **all four (4) years** of your Bachelor's degree
- Any transcripts or certificates received beyond your Bachelor's degree program
- Proof of English proficiency²
 - **TOEFL Score of 88 on the internet-based test;** or
 - **IELTS Score of 6.5 overall (preferred)**
- Statement of Purpose (*recommended*)
- A copy of your passport
- Two (2) letters of recommendation from professors who are familiar with your undergraduate work (*recommended*)
